TRACK 1 **PARTNERSHIPS**

Explore new kinds of multi-stakeholder partnerships across the forum's four pillars, each composed of UN system departments/agencies, states, the private sector, philanthropists, and broader civil society groups.

TRACK 2 **INNOVATIONS**



Development of "Global Governance Institutional, Policy, and Normative Innovations for UN 75 & Beyond" that both complement and improve the conditions for effective multi-stakeholder partnerships promoted in Track 1.



TRACK 1: EXAMPLE PARTNERSHIPS

- Establishment of a UN Global Partnership to improve policy development and implementation, involving the Secretary-General, World Bank President, a new civil society-led Committee on Civil Society-UN Relations, and the UN Global Compact.
- Strengthening cybersecurity through new cyber-crime centers (e.g., engaging the Alliance for Multilateralism and the Paris Call for Trust and Security in Cyberspace, major tech and philanthropic institutions, the United Nations, and partners in the Global South and civil society)
- Bringing together Silicon Valley tech companies with ongoing UN Office for Partnerships initiatives.
- New divestment strategies facilitated by the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, the global investment community, and UN experts to support climate mitigation/adaptation and global nuclear disarmament.

TRACK 2: EXAMPLE INNOVATIONS

- Stand-up a **UN Civilian Response Capability** for improved conflict management and recovery assistance
- Create a **G20+** to enhance coordination with the UN system, Bretton Woods institutions, and related bodies, and give it a small secretariat
- Assemble a **UN Parliamentary Network** as an advisory body to the General Assembly under Charter Article 22
- Establish a **Green Technology Licensing Facility** in the Green Climate Fund.



OPPORTUNITIES TO PARTICIPATE

- Be part of a global network from governments, UN agencies, non-governmental organizations, the business community, and philanthropic sector.
- Pursue creative new multi-stakeholder partnerships with UN system and government leaders.
